MINUTES

The Village Board of Trustees of the Village of Bertrand, Nebraska held a Regular Meeting on August 11, 2020 at 7:30 PM at the Village Hall by publishing in the Holdrege Daily Citizen on August 3, 2020 and posting at the First State Bank, Post Office, and Village Office. The agenda for said meeting was kept continuously at the office of the Village Clerk. Present were Chairman TJ Wilcox, and Trustees Robert Dahlgren, Lucas Evans, Brian Schroeder, and Fred Spiegel. Dahlgren joined the meeting at 7:32 PM.

The Chairman opened the meeting and publicly stated to all in attendance that a copy of the Nebraska Open Meetings Act was available for review and indicated the location of such copy posted in the room where the meeting was being held.

On a motion by Schroeder, seconded by Spiegel, the consent agenda was approved. Voting Aye, Schroeder, Spiegel, Evans, Wilcox. Dahlgren absent. The items on the consent agenda were as follows: the minutes for the Regular Meeting held on July 14, 2020; the Village Financials for July; the Village payables for July in an amount not to exceed \$75,054.62; the Village employees' salaries for the month of August in an amount not to exceed \$32,000; a Building Permit request from Marcus Schwarz to construct multiple cement pads at 406 Marshall; Resolution No. 430 regarding the Annual Compliance Certification for the Nebraska Board of Public Roads Classifications and Standards, the resolution reads as follows:

RESOLUTION NO. 430

WHEREAS: State of Nebraska Statutes, sections 39-2115, 39-2119, 39-2120, 39-2121 and 39-2520(2), requires an annual certification of program compliance to the Nebraska Board of Public Roads Classifications and Standards; and

WHEREAS: State of Nebraska Statute, section 39-2120 also requires that the annual certification of program compliance by each municipality shall be signed by the Village Board Chairperson and shall include a copy of a resolution of the governing body of the municipality authorizing the signing of the certification form.

Dahlgren abstained. On a motion by Dahlgren, seconded by Schroeder, the remaining payables for August were accepted in an amount not to exceed \$145,000. On a motion by Spiegel, seconded by Schroeder, the Nursing Home employees' salaries for the month of September were accepted in an amount not to exceed \$95,000. On a motion by Dahlgren, seconded by Schroeder, the July payable for the Village to Evans Repair in the amount of \$34.52 was accepted. Voting Aye, Dahlgren, Schroeder, Spiegel, Wilcox. Evans abstained. Brian Langenberg, Miller and Associates, presented the Board with a survey for a lot split located at 73467 A Road. This property is located within the Village's one-mile zoning jurisdiction, so he has asked the Board to approve this split according to Phelps County zoning guidelines. On a motion by Dahlgren, seconded by Spiegel, the lot split between Ivan Donnoe and family was approved. Voting Aye, Dahlgren, Spiegel, Evans, Schroeder, Wilcox.

The Countryside Market would like to replace the air conditioner. However, due to the height of the building and safety of customers, they cannot place it on the roof as is the current location. They would like to enter into an easement with the Village. On a motion by Dahlgren, seconded by Spiegel, the easement between the Village of Bertrand and Countryside Market was approved. Brian Langenberg, Miller and Associates, will contact Village Attorney to process easement. Voting Aye, Dahlgren, Spiegel, Evans, Wilcox. Schroeder abstained.

The Village will hold a Budget Work Session on August 18, 2020 at 5:00 PM at the Village Hall.

James Nelson, Village Ordinance Officer, presented the Board with a review of properties still in abatement. Letters will be sent to those properties owners regarding the state of their property for demolition. The remaining properties will be discussed at the September Regular Meeting. On a motion by Spiegel, seconded by Evans, Resolution No. 431 to declare that property 2019-BERT-4131 is clear of all nuisances and rescind it from abatement was approved. Voting Aye, Spiegel, Evans, Dahlgren, Schroeder, Wilcox. The resolution reads as follows:

WHEREAS, THE Village of Bertrand is engaged in a Nuisance Abatement process; and WHEREAS, the Village has appointed James Nelson as the Village Nuisance Officer; and WHEREAS, the Nuisance Officer identified and confirmed that in his opinion a nuisance existed as defined by Federal, State, or Village law; and the Village Board at a regular meeting, identified a nuisance property, supported by evidence; and

WHEREAS, the Nuisance Officer now has evidence that the nuisance violation declared in Resolution No. 2019-406:4131 is abated and the property cleared of nuisances.
