MINUTES

The Village Board of Trustees of the Village of Bertrand, Nebraska held a Regular Meeting on September 14, 2021, immediately following the Board of Zoning Adjustments Hearing by publishing in the Holdrege Daily Citizen on August 31, 2021, and posting at the First State Bank, Post Office, and Village Office. The agenda for said meeting was kept continuously at the office of the Village Clerk and was available for review upon request. Present were Chairman TJ Wilcox and Trustees Robert Dahlgren, Lucas Evans, Brian Schroeder, and Fred Spiegel.

The Chairman opened the meeting at 7:36 PM and publicly stated to all in attendance that a copy of the Nebraska Open Meetings Act was available for review and indicated the location of such copy posted in the room where the meeting was being held.

On a motion by Spiegel, seconded by Schroeder, the consent agenda was approved. Voting Aye, Spiegel, Schroeder, Dahlgren, Evans, Wilcox. On a motion by Spiegel, seconded by Dahlgren, the bid from Waste Connection of NE was accepted with services to start on January 1, 2022, for a three-year time period. Voting Aye, Spiegel, Dahlgren, Evans, Schroeder Wilcox.

On a motion by Spiegel, seconded by Schroeder, the total restricted funds authority was increased by an additional 1%. Voting Aye, Spiegel, Schroeder, Evans, Wilcox. Absent, Dahlgren.

On a motion by Spiegel, seconded by Schroeder, Resolution No. 454 to set the final property tax request was approved. Voting Aye, Spiegel, Schroeder, Evans, Wilcox. Absent, Dahlgren. The Resolution reads as follows:

RESOLUTION NO. 454

of the

VILLAGE OF BERTRAND, NEBRASKA

WHEREAS, Nebraska Revised Statute 77-1601.02 provides that Governing Body of the Village of Bertrand passes by a majority vote a resolution or ordinance setting the tax request; and

WHEREAS, a special public hearing was held as required by law to hear and consider comments concerning the property tax request;

NOW THEREFORE, the Governing Body of the Village of Bertrand, resolves that:

- 1. The 2021-2022 property tax request be set at:
 - a. General Fund: \$162,964.00
 - b. Bond Fund: \$175,000.00
- 2. The total assessed value of property differs from last year's total assessed value by 6%.
- 3. The tax rate which would levy the same amount of property taxes as last year, when multiplied by the new total assessed value of property would be \$1.008481 per \$100 of assessed value.
- 4. The Village of Bertrand proposes to adopt a property tax request that will cause its tax rate to be \$1.036929 per \$100 assessed value.
- 5. Based on the proposed property tax request and changes in other revenue, the total operating budget of the Village of Bertrand will decrease last year's budget by 9%.
- 6. A copy of this resolution be certified and forwarded to the County Clerk on or before October 13, 2021.

Dated this 14th day of September 2021.

Chairman Wilcox introduced Ordinance No. 733 which adopts the budget statement to be termed the annual appropriation bill for the fiscal year 2021-2022 and appropriates sums for necessary expenses and liabilities. On a motion by Spiegel, seconded by Evans, the statutory rule requiring an ordinance to be fully and distinctly read on three different days was waived. Voting Aye, Spiegel, Evans, Schroeder, Wilcox. Absent, Dahlgren. The motion to suspend the rule was adopted by three-fourths of the members elected to the Board and the statutory rule was declared suspended for consideration of said Ordinance. Thereupon said Ordinance No. 733 when then read by title and Trustee Spiegel moved for its final passage, which motion was seconded by Evans. Voting Aye, Spiegel, Evans, Schroeder, Wilcox Absent, Dahlgren. The Ordinance reads as follows:

ORDINANCE NO. 733 of the VILLAGE OF BERTRAND, NEBRASKA

AN ORDINANCE OF THE VILLAGE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF BERTRAND, NEBRASKA TO ADOPT THE BUDGET STATEMENT TO BE TERMED THE ANNUAL APPROPRIATION BILL; TO APPROPRIATE SUMS FOR NECESSARY EXPENSES AND LIABILITIES; TO PROVIDE FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE VILLAGE BOARD OF THE VILLAGE OF BERTRAND, NEBRASKA:

Section 1. That after complying with all procedures required by law, the budget presented and set forth in the budget statement is hereby approved as the Annual Appropriation Bill for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 2021, through September 30, 2022. All sums of money contained in the budget statement are hereby appropriated for the necessary expenses and liabilities of the Village of Bertrand. A copy of the budget document shall be forwarded as provided by law to the Auditor of Public Accounts, State Capitol, Lincoln, Nebraska, and to the County Clerk of Phelps County, Nebraska, for use by the levying authority.

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage, approval, and publication or posting as required by law.

PASSED AND APPROVED THIS 14TH DAY OF SEPTEMBER 2021.

On a motion by Spiegel, seconded by Schroeder, the Contractor's Application for Payment No. 2 from RMV Construction, as approved by JEO Consulting Group, for the pool project in the amount of \$57,515.40 was approved. Voting Aye, Spiegel, Schroeder, Dahlgren, Evans, Wilcox.

The Board discussed the proposed change order from Kidwell. This is the electrical company that is providing temporary electrical service at the pool project. In order to install service, they were charged by Southern Power for an initial set up. Per JEO Consulting Group and the contract between the Village and RMV Construction, this cost should be covered by the Village. On a motion by Schroeder, seconded by Evans, the proposed change order from Kidwell for electrical services for the pool project in the amount of \$1,317.97 was approved. Voting Aye, Schroeder, Evans, Spiegel, Wilcox. Voting Nay, Dahlgren.

On a motion by Spiegel, seconded by Schroeder, Resolution No. 453 regarding the Community Development Assistance Act tax credit for the construction of the new swimming pool was approved. Voting Aye, Spiegel, Schroeder, Dahlgren, Evans, Wilcox. The Resolution reads as follows:

A RESOLUTION OF THE VILLAGE OF BERTRAND, NEBRASKA REQUESTING COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT ASSISTANCE ACT TAX CREDITS FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF THE NEW BERTRAND AQUATIC CENTER.

WHEREAS, the Village of Bertrand, Nebraska is requesting Community Development Assistance Act (CDAA) tax credits for the construction of the new Bertrand Aquatic Center; and

WHEREAS, THE Bertrand Village Board has reviewed the CDAA application and determined that the proposed project was consistent with the community's long-term plan; and

WHEREAS, requested CDAA tax credits, in the amount of \$25,000 will be utilized to leverage private donations to provide the undertaking of the proposed project; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF BERTRAND, NEBRASKA, THAT:

The Bertrand Village Board has reviewed and supports the submittal of the Community Development Assistance Act Project Application to the Nebraska Department of Economic Development requesting \$25,000 in tax credit assistance to implement the Bertrand Aquatic Center.

PASSED AND APPROVED THIS 14TH DAY OF SEPTEMBER 2021.

The Board reviewed and discussed the status of the water rates. As of October 1, 2021, this rates will be non-taxable.

Meeting as the Board of Adjustment, the Board reviewed the Variance request from Steve Winheim. Winheim would like to construct an attached garage to his property located at 401 Highland Avenue. This is in violation of Bertrand Municipal Code Section 9-105 which states that footings of buildings must be twenty-five feet from the front property line. The existing structure has a 16-foot setback from the property line. On a motion by Dahlgren, seconded by Spiegel, the Variance Permit request from Steve Winheim to forgo the set back regulation to construct an attached garage was approved. Voting Aye, Dahlgren, Spiegel, Evans, Schroeder, Wilcox.

On a motion by Schroeder, seconded by Evans, the Fence Permit request from Cross Diamond Cattle to construct a 6' wood privacy fence at 508 Melbourne was approved. Voting Aye, Schroeder, Evans, Dahlgren, Spiegel, Wilcox.

On a motion by Evans, seconded by Dahlgren, the Building Permit request from Hi-Line Ag to construct an 80'x60'x20' addition to the current building located at 1110 Kennett Street was approved. Voting Aye Evans, Dahlgren, Schroeder, Spiegel, Wilcox.

On a motion by Spiegel, seconded by Schroeder, the Building Permit request from Steve Winheim to construct a 13.5'x26.5'x15' attached garage to existing house was approved. Voting Aye, Spiegel, Schroeder, Dahlgren, Evans, Wilcox.

Village Ordinance Officer, James Nelson, gave his report to the Board. He reported that the stray cat problem through the Village is slowly dwindling. He also informed the Board that a resident should be obtaining a hobby permit for vehicles located at the railroad property.

Village Utilities Superintendent, Matt Gregg, gave his report to the Board. He informed the Board that he will be attending the Rural Water Conference at the end of September and the Mosquito and Vector Control conference in October. He reported that Well #2 is no longer operational. He will be working with Sargent Irrigation for solutions. The rainstorm on Sept. 2 has cause significant damages to the swimming pool project. RMV Construction has submitted a proposed change order for the correction of these damages. However, JEO Consulting Group does not believe the Village is liable. Information has been sent to the Village Attorney and will be addressed at a later date. Finally, he reported that if the County were to give ARPA funds to the towns in Phelps County, he would like to look into building a second sewer lagoon.

Village Clerk, Lori Vinzant, gave her report to the Board. She approached the Board regarding the current swimming pool rates. The Board decided that the citizens within the corporate limits should have free access to the new swimming pool. A resolution will be presented at the following meeting. She also informed the Board that the new software and camera system has been installed at the Yard Waste Site and they are in the process of transferring the current cards over.

There being no further business, a motion was made by Dahlgren and seconded by Schroeder to adjourn the meeting at 8:46 PM. Voting Aye, Dahlgren, Schroeder, Evans, Spiegel, Wilcox.
