Golf Cart License

\$15.00 per vehicle *proof of insurance required

An all-terrain vehicle, scooter, UTV or golf cart may be operated on the streets and highways, within the corporate limits of the Village of Bertrand only if the operator complies with the rules of the road set by the State of Nebraska. Operator must be at least 16 years old and have a valid driver's license. Operators

and passengers must be restrained in the vehicle or seated at all time. Parking on the sidewalks of the Village is NOT allowed. *(Ordinance No. 674)*

Building Permits

Summer is around the corner and outdoor projects have started. The Village would like to remind you that a Building or Fence permit is required for certain outdoor projects. Building permits must be obtained (and approved) before you start any construction on your property.

Building Permits are required for:

	New Buildings/Move In Building	Additions/Alterations	Patios/Decks

The fee for a building permit is \$10.00 per permit. This fee is waived for any accessory buildings under 150 sq. ft. or the demolition of a building. Applications must be submitted the Friday prior to the Board Meeting (2nd Tuesday of the month).

Before you beginning any digging whatsoever, you must contact Digger's Hotline at 1-800-331-5666 or 811. To get a permit application, please stop by the Village Office at 507 Minor Avenue, Bertrand, NE. If you have any further questions, please contact the Office at 308-472-3455 or Matt Gregg at 308-991-8045.

Bertrand Fire & Rescue News

Burn Permit Information— Open burning in the state of Nebraska requires a burn permit issued by the fire department in your district. Permits can only be issued for the purpose of clearing land. This would include grass, brush, and trees. Contact Chief Kevin Stehl at 308-991-4574, John Ford at 308-991-1066, or Jim Campbell at 308-472-3264 to obtain a permit.

It's that time of the year again when severe weather is possible. A **watch** means that hazardous weather is possible. A **warning** is issued when a hazardous weather event is

occurring, imminent or likely. A **warning** means weather conditions pose a threat to life or property. If there is a warning for our area, the siren will blow one long blast for one minute. That will be your indication to take shelter. Monitor local radio or television for updates from the National Weather Service. There will be no "all clear" issued by the fire department for liability reasons. - Kevin Stehl, Fire Chief

Yard Waste Site Rules and Regulations			
Recently there has been an increase in the Yard Waste Site violations. Because we cannot be everywhere at once, we are asking for the public's help in this matter. If you see any illegal dumping, please contact the Village Office at 472-3455 or Matt Gregg at 991-8045. The grass that is accumulated at the site is eventually taken to a farmer's field to be spread around. This is the reason that the grass pile CANNOT contain any trash. Please remove all trash before dumping your grass.			
1. Only grass, leaves, garden waste, branches, trees and white goods will be allowed at the site. *White Goods Include: refrigerators, stoves, washers, dryers, dishwashers, and hot water heaters.			
2. No more than three (3) vehicles will be allowed in the dumping area at the same time.			
3. All items must be separated before dumping.			
4. The pit is for trees, twigs, small branches and untreated wood only.			
5. The grass pile is for grass, leaves, garden and yard waste. If these items are brought out in plastic bags, they will have to be dumped out and the bag or container taken back. Absolutely no cans, plastic, paper, etc. can be mixed with the grass, leaves or garden/yard waste.			
6. Batteries, tires and chemical/paints are NOT allowed at the Yard Waste Site.			
7. Wire, bedsprings, furniture, TVs and small appliances are allowed in the large dumpster located at the site.			
 Any shingles, siding or other building materials that might contain asbestos must be bagged and taken to the Holdrege landfill site. 			
 All loads from outside of the Village of Bertrand limits must obtain a permit and pay a deposit and dumping fee at the Village Office.

Notice: Any abuse at the site can be tracked, as the program has the capability of tracking who used the site on any given day or time. Video cameras are also installed at the site, and the Municipal Utilities Superintendent can view the violation as it is being committed. The Municipal Superintendent is authorized to asses a fine of up to, but not more than, \$250 per violation, in which event the fine shall be due and payable to the Village Clerk within 10 days after the date of the citation. A second violation and/or failure to pay a fine on or before the due date thereof shall be subject to an immediate loss of privileges to access and use of the yard waste site.

YOUNG AT HEART SENIOR CENTER


